

# BMP SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM TO ENCOURAGE THE NEXT GENERATION OF HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONALS

### The BMP Foundation Scholarships serve two objectives:

- ➤ To encourage and assist local students to undertake or pursue college studies in the field of health or nursing, depending on the scholarship provided;
- ➤ To establish and nurture a positive working relationship between the recipient and the BMP Hospital (CIUSSS de l'Estrie CHUS La Pommeraie) as a possible place of future employment.

The program is open to any graduating high school student, who resides within the Brome-Missisquoi territory, and who wish to pursue studies in a health care or nursing profession.

Recipients each receive a \$1,000 scholarship, renewable each year of their CEGEP studies, for a maximum of three years.

### **SCHOOL BURSARIES**

The Foundation also supports the local high schools to provide awards of excellence for graduate students who wish to continue their studies in healthcare. Students are selected by their school including: École secondaire Wilfrid-Léger, École Jean-Jacques-Bertrand and École secondaire Massey-Vanier (French and English components).

### STUDENT VISITS

The BMP Foundation organizes guided school visits for students at the end of their course from the four regional high schools to enable them to discover career opportunities in the healthcare field at the BMP Hospital. Each year, **60-70 students go on these one-day visits** and are exposed to careers in medicine, nursing, laboratory, pharmacy, physiotherapy, occupational therapy, medical imaging, and respiratory therapy.

### 2019-2020 PROJECTS

In 2019, the Chawkers Foundation gave the BMP Foundation a generous contribution that not only allowed the continuation of the scholarship program (CEGEP and high school) for the coming years, but also **the implementation of a second scholarship** for a student at CEGEP: **The BMP Scholarship** – **Nursing**.


# Cumulative percentage of administrative expenditure over the last 5 years

# **GREAT ACHIEVEMENTS**

### THANKS TO THE FOUNDATION'S INVESTMENTS IN 2018 - 2019

### PHYSIOTHERAPY - \$10 000

### Three new acquisitions for patient care. Project completed in 2019

The **videonystagmoscope** is a tool that makes it possible to better evaluate the source of vertigo and treat vestibular pathologies (balance in the inner ear). The physiotherapy department now also benefits from its own **Bio-Stim** electromagnetic field device to treat chronic pain cases using extreme low frequency electromagnetic fields. Finally, a **television** set was added in the rehabilitation room on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor. This addition attracts attention and helps patients who have suffered a stroke or a serious illness resulting in severe loss of autonomy to keep standing longer.



### MEDICAL IMAGING DEPARTMENT - \$85 000

Replacement of the portable analog radiology device by a mobile digital one.

#### **Project completed in 2018**

With the financial support of the BMP Hospital Auxiliaries and the BMP Foundation, the BMP Hospital was able to replace its portable analog radiology device with a mobile digital radiology unit. This state-of-the-art device allows the radiology system to be brought directly to the patient. Thus, the nursing staff receives an immediate and precise first diagnosis without having to move the patient, which can sometimes be very complicated depending on his condition. Radiologists can observe several parts of the body with this device, such as the lungs, bones and abdomen.



#### FUNDING OF DIFFERENT EQUIPMENT AND TRAINING COURSES - \$55 400

Small additions that make a difference for the patient and medical staff

#### Projects completed in 2018-2019

The BMP Foundation finances large-scale projects, but also smaller ones which have a significant impact within the Hospital. From gynecological equipment such as the **Luikart forceps** for births, **wheelchairs** for patients treated by the home care team, to high-tech devices such as **mobile monitors** for **Holter exams**, these investments bring a high level of quality to the care provided. In addition to the equipment, the Foundation also supports many training programs for the health care personnel, including the **training of internationally recognized lactation consultants** for health care practitioners. Although large projects are more visible to the community, small projects are still indispensable and their impact is just as important.



# **GREAT PROJECTS**

FOR 2018 - 2020

#### ORTHOPEDIC CLINIC - 1.3 Million dollars

#### Make treatment facilities more accessible and confidential

The redevelopment and relocation of the Orthopedic Clinic on the ground floor of the hospital will be completed by the end of 2019, early 2020. The clinic will now be located close to related services such as medical imaging and will be more easily accessible for clients with reduced mobility. In addition, the new consultation spaces and rooms will be more confidential and better adapted to the ever-increasing volume of patients.



### PATIENT SUPPORT AT THE ONCOLOGY CLINIC - \$ 18 000

#### Encourage patients' self-well-being

Since the opening of the oncology clinic in 2018, the BMP Foundation has been working to develop services to support patients affected by cancer. One of the initiatives is the implementation of yoga sessions specifically adapted for people affected by cancer; the free courses are given by a certified professional in the field. A second initiative is the enhancement of the hours of service of a spiritual care coordinator to support patients during these difficult times. This coordinator will help people through individual meetings as well as during support groups specifically reserved for people diagnosed with cancer.



### IMPROVEMENTS TO THE EMERGENCY SERVICE

#### Providing a superior patient experience

The Foundation and key emergency department personnel are currently working on several concrete ways to improve the triage, monitoring and overall functioning of emergencies. This project will focus in particular on the care of the elderly and the assessment of patients' condition. All this with the global objective of reducing waiting times and increasing the quality of patient experience.

### MAJOR CAPITAL CAMPAIGN - Objective of 5 Million dollars

Last October 2018, the Brome-Missisquoi-Perkins Foundation announced the launch of its 2018 - 2022 Major Campaign, whose goal is to raise 5 million dollars to improve the orthopedic clinic and operating room as well as acquire state-of-the-art equipment. To date, the amount of donations offered has reached \$4,068,193, which is already 81% of the objective pursued!
