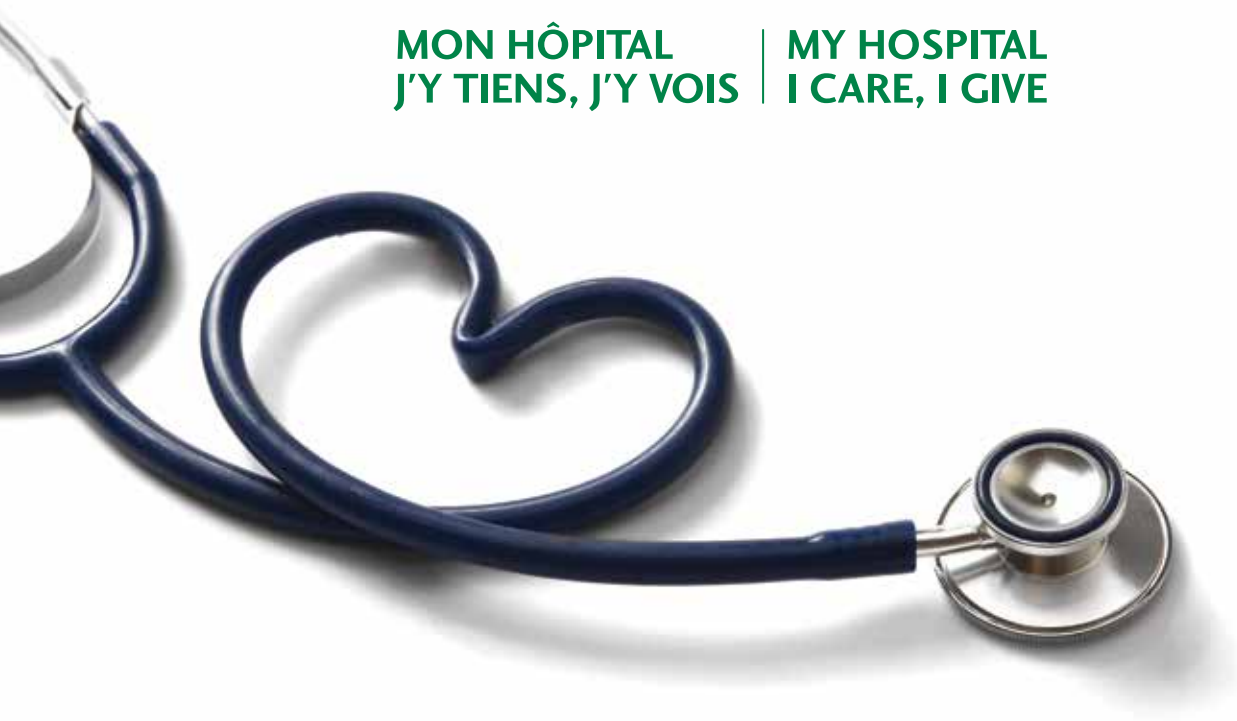




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MISSION AND ACHIEVEMENTS

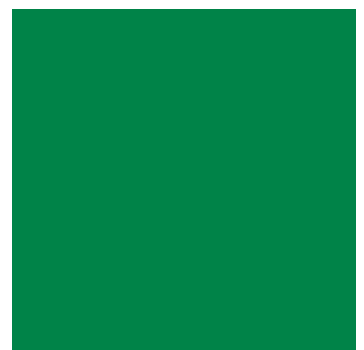

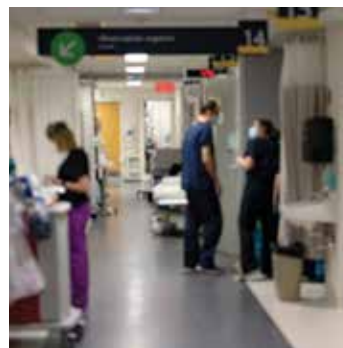

For nearly 30 years now, the Brome-Missisquoi-Perkins Hospital Foundation has been contributing to improving the accessibility and quality of care and services offered to the population of its region. Despite the pandemic, which made it difficult to organize activities, the Foundation held numerous events again this year that raised significant amounts of money, which were reinvested in various projects to benefit patients. The Foundation has remained close to its donors and proved to be innovative by hosting virtual shows and online auctions.

Among the achievements that were made possible thanks to the Foundation's financial contribution, we would like to mention the purchase of a Mini C-Arm, a fluoroscopy machine that improves the surgical services offered in the operating room of the Brome-Missisquoi-Perkins Hospital. We should also mention the acquisition of adapted equipment and material to help maintain the autonomy of people living in the CHSLDs and those receiving home care. The Foundation also helped finance the deployment of the CIUSSS de l'Estrie - CHUS mobile unit, whose first activities were COVID-19 screening and vaccination.

This was another year in which the Foundation was a valuable partner of the CIUSSS de l'Estrie - CHUS. On behalf of the patients and our internal community, we warmly thank the Foundation for its remarkable commitment.





IMPROVEMENT AND COMPASSION PROJECTS

Thanks to the support of all our donors, the BMP Foundation has been able to improve health care treatment to our community families via projects that raised more than \$155,000. Let us enumerate the following projects:

We participated in commissioning a mobile unit (bus).

On its 47 outing throughout the Eastern Townships, the team vaccinated more than 2,500 people against COVID-19.



We acquired 20 digital tablets to maintain connections between the seniors of the CHSLD de la Pommerai e and their families.



We acquired numerous items for the Respiratory Therapy Department.

- **We bought six infusion pumps** that assist in the administration of intravenous medications and ease the workload of nursing staff by automatically injecting the right amount of solute at the right time.
- **We acquired an Aeroneb device** to facilitate the treatment of patients requiring mechanical ventilation and to make them more comfortable while hospitalized.
- **We financed a mechanical cough aid** that allows for quicker management and provides relief for patients suffering from bronchial congestion.
- **We acquired a storage cart** specific to the massive transfusion protocol that allows for the rapid and mobile handling of patients in respiratory distress.



We purchased safety equipment for patients receiving home care.

This type of equipment reduces the need for short or long-term hospitalization and allows patients to stay in their homes longer while receiving quality care.





IMPROVEMENT AND COMPASSION PROJECTS

Two additional acquisitions allowed for more advanced ophthalmology procedures that were not available in the Brome-Missisquoi territory until recently.

- **We acquired a trabeculectomy tray for the operating room.**

Depending on the severity of the disease, glaucoma patients may require medical or surgical treatment, such as trabeculectomy, to reduce intraocular pressure and prevent visual degeneration.

- **We purchased an autofluorescence module** that allows for better evaluation of patients struggling with inflammatory eye disease.

This technology is essential to detect alterations in the eye's retinal layers and prevent severe optic nerve degeneration.



There is a new team of lactation consultants in Estrie!

Congratulations to Alyssa Morin, Andréanne Lebel, Cassandre Tessier, Gabrielle Lavoie, Jacinthe Prévost, Julie Couture, Nancy-Ann Quirion, Marie Bergeron and Sophie Arcand. Your recent accomplishments will be greatly valued by your colleagues and the families of the Eastern Townships! We are pleased to be one of the Foundations that finance trainings with the following organizations: Opération Enfant Soleil, the Fondation du CLSC et CHSLD du Haut-Saint-François and the Fondation du Centre hospitalier de Granby.



Zootherapy sessions

Since October 2021, the BMP Foundation has been funding **two monthly zootherapy sessions for the BMP Hospital** residents. Just before the Christmas holidays, our team, accompanied by Chloé-Marie Daigle, BMP Hospital Recreation and Activities Educator, and Isabelle Bouthillette, animal therapist, met the residents. This initiative was made possible thanks to all of BMP's donors, whom we wish to thank.

Every donation counts and makes it possible to carry out small projects that have a big impact on the lives of residents. THANK YOU!

"The goal is ultimately to make people happy. When residents get in contact with animals, they can forget about their situation and their pain. It's a good distraction," explains Chloe-Marie.





UPCOMING INVESTMENTS

The BMP Foundation has spent a great deal of time with diverse teams to identify needs for improvement within the Brome-Missisquoi-Perkins Hospital. We are pleased to announce that several acquisitions are underway, totaling a future investment of \$668,287.

For the operating room, we are investing in a heating cabinet to place blankets, an anesthesiology cart, and a Mini C-Arm machine. This mobile medical imaging device will reduce waiting times and radiation during surgery thanks to its savvy new technology. In addition, since it can be operated by a trained nurse, the Mini C-Arm can be used during hours when radiology staff are not available or otherwise busy. By facilitating the surgical process, this device will contribute to the optimization of all daytime operations. As a result, more patients will be treated.



For the gynecology department, the Foundation purchased a NovaSure. This endometrial vaporization system using radiofrequency waves is used in the treatment of endometriosis, a disorder in which tissue similar to the tissue which lines the inside of the uterus grows outside the uterus. It affects many women.



For the oncology department, the Foundation bought vital sign monitors that are installed at the bedside of patients going through chemotherapy treatments. These monitors are instrumental in weighing in on patients' conditions and preventively managing their state of wellbeing in case of illness.



Finally, we are working on purchasing several items, such as **telemetry boxes**, new beds for the Hospital and for the clinic La Pommeraie, an ophthalmologic topographer, as well as various equipment for the CLSC clinics.



We are also in the process of implementing the **Entertain Me** project at the Emergency Department! In collaboration with the Special Education Technician, this project consists of acquiring play-based material to entertain and mobilize hospitalized seniors to reduce risks of confusion and episodes of delirium.

WELCOME TO THE WORLD!



The Brome-Missisquoi-Perkins Hospital has long been reputed for its birthing pavilion. As Canada's first baby-friendly hospital, it has always been important for the BMP Hospital to offer Brome-Missisquoi parents ideal delivery conditions. To provide the best possible support, the BMP Foundation has, over the past few years and with the support of its donors, funded the *Welcome to the World!* initiative. Created by Édith Cambrini and Marilyne Saint-Pierre, this art project has already brought together three groups of parents who gave birth during the pandemic and who had to deal with the challenges of isolation brought on by health restrictions.

SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAMS

The Brome-Missisquoi-Perkins Hospital Foundation scholarships have two objectives:

- To encourage and assist students from the region to undertake or pursue post-secondary studies in the field of health or nursing, depending on the scholarship.
- To establish and promote a positive relationship between the recipient and the BMP Hospital (CIUSSS de l'Estrie - CHUS La Pommeraiie), which may lead to an offer of employment.



HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

The Foundation supports local high schools who grant \$1,000 scholarships to graduates who wish to pursue their studies in the field of healthcare. These students are selected by their educational institution.

CÉGEP SCHOLARSHIPS

Thanks to the Chawkers Foundation's generous contribution, we were able to continue to offer scholar programs for years to come and also increase the amount of the scholarship to \$2,000 per year for each of the scholarship recipients.

The BMP Health Care Scholarship is intended for graduating seniors from local high schools who intend to pursue studies in DEC programs in Natural Sciences. In 2021, Rachel Michaud received this scholarship. The BMP Nursing Scholarship targets future nursing students only and encourages young people to invest in the nursing field, which is currently under-resourced. Rebecca Thomas obtained this scholarship in 2021. The two scholarships provide \$6,000 each (\$2,000 per year for up to 3 years). The two scholarship winners will be chosen by a selection committee composed of a Principal, a BMP Hospital staff member, and a community member.

In 2021, a *Coup de Coeur* grant was also awarded to an exceptional candidate whose work the BMP Foundation wishes to highlight: that of Mathilde Quintin.

SCHOOL VISITS

Due to health sanitary restrictions, the BMP Foundation was not able to welcome high school students for guided tours in 2021. Our Foundation is committed to this activity and intends to resume it, when conditions permit, to continue to inspire young students to pursue a career in health care.

UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIPS

In honour of Mrs. Effie Margaret Côté

In November 2020, we were pleased to present a brand-new scholarship offered by the BMP Foundation: the Effie Margaret Côté Scholarship. This important scholarship of \$10,000 is offered to a current nursing student or health care-worker who is continuing their training at the university level. In 2021, the scholarship was offered to Marie-Hélène Lemée.

A long-time volunteer with a passion for her community, Effie Margaret Côté has been involved with the BMP Hospital for over 30 years. This award is a tribute to her commitment to our hospital. Effie has been a dedicated volunteer throughout her life. During World War II, she began as a volunteer with the Women's Catholic League, which provided hot meals to soldiers. Upon her arrival in our area, Effie became an active volunteer at the BMP Hospital Auxiliaries and the Knowlton Wellness Project. Appointed to the Board of Directors of the BMP Hospital from 1982 to 1984, she received the International Women's Day Award from the Yamaska Valley Optimist Club in 2008. She was also named Volunteer of the Year by the BMP Hospital in 2009.

Effie Margaret Côté is now 100 years old.

She lives independently in her Knowlton apartment and leads a very active life with five children, eight grandchildren, and six great-grandchildren. Four years ago, she got her driver's license and bought a new car. To recognize their mother's remarkable life, her children decided to establish this annual \$10,000 scholarship with the BMP Foundation.
