Thanks to the Foundation and the donors who support it, we can acquire state-of-the-art medical equipment year after year, offer more employee training, and improve care spaces.

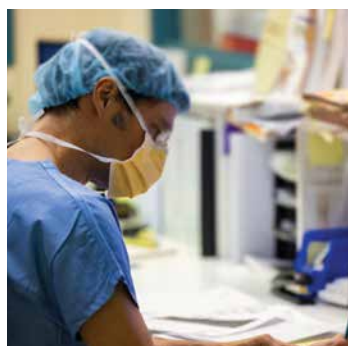
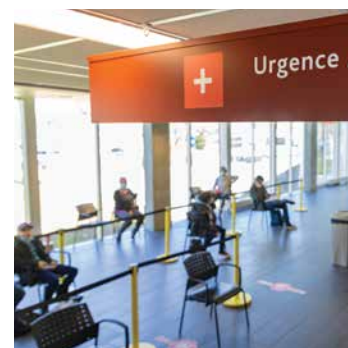
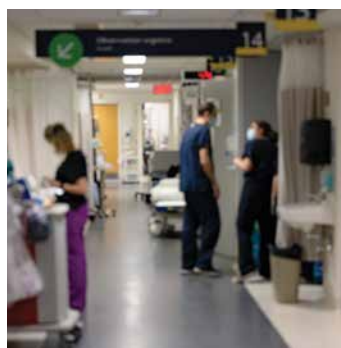

Welcome to the World



For the Operatory Room: A Mini C-Arm. This medical imagery portable device reduces waiting time during surgeries and cuts back on radiation emission, thanks to its new and advanced technology. Furthermore, since it can be manipulated by a trained nurse, it is operational during hours when imagery staff members are busy or unavailable. By facilitating surgeries, this device contributes to the optimization of all daytime interventions and allows the processing of more patients.

For the Oncology Department: vital signs monitors were installed at chemotherapy patients’ bedsides to allow a close monitoring of their state and a quick intervention, if necessary.



The BMP Foundation has thoroughly consulted with various departments of the BMP Hospital to identify the next necessary improvements. We are happy to announce that over \$245,945 are already allocated to future acquisitions!

Centralized Automated Cabinets

Every hospital has a pharmacy that prepares medication for all inpatients and employs many technicians and pharmacists. In 2013, the Ministry of Health and Social Services launched a major project, requesting hospitals to make pharmaceutical care and services safer. The first step in this project was to secure the storage and administration of medications in critical care units or units delivering a lot of medication. Decentralized automated cabinets were installed in numerous departments of BMP Hospital: at the emergency ward, the intensive care unit, the surgery room, and the medicine unit.

The BMP Foundation now wishes to secure pharmaceutical products in two other departments: the Birthing Pavilion and the Operating Room.

The need for these departments is great due to their high use of narcotics and medicine labelled dangerous. The acquisition of two decentralized automated cabinets, as well as training staff in the use of this equipment, represents a total investment of \$171,000.

Drug-related errors represent more than 50% of the incidents-accidents reported in Quebec hospitals.

How does it work?

The cabinet is linked to the pharmacy's informatic system, which carries clinical and biometric data about each patient. As such, it can authorize the safe withdrawal of the drug. In addition, drugs considered unsafe by Accreditation Canada are targeted to ensure greater vigilance on the part of nursing staff. As a result, controlling the use of narcotics is faster and more efficient.

The use of a decentralized automated cabinet secures procedures while saving time. Nursing staff must no longer fill out several forms nor wait for pharmacies to deliver certain drugs.

The decentralized automated cabinet will facilitate our work by automatically keeping the medication inventory up to date, putting aside the need to place daily orders. It also reduces the risk of errors when administering medication. Finally, we'll save time by eliminating the need to do counts at the beginning and end of the day. Thank you for your support!

At our hospital, 100% of admitted patients take at least one medication. Thanks to this project, we can reduce the risk of errors by facilitating and securing the administration of medication. Each medication is stored in a secure locker. When the nurse selects a medication, only the selected drug is available. In addition, since the cabinets are directly installed in the care units, the nurse has rapid access to emergency medication and can therefore intervene more quickly. Safety, quality and efficiency: these are the objectives we seek to attain with this project.

Other projects in progress:

- Entertainment for seniors: a Smartboard, valued at \$8,540
- A Bladder scan, worth \$17,000
- Breastfeeding chairs for the CLSC in Cowansville, valued at \$12,295
- CHSLD Sutton living environment improvements, worth \$17,453
- Wishower bath station used after loss of autonomy, worth \$19,657

Major work to upgrade a key area of the BMP Hospital will have a substantial impact on patient care and hospital operations. The Foundation looks forward to sharing major news with you over the course of 2023-2024!

Closing of the 2018-2022 Capital Campaign

AN EXTRAORDINARY EFFORT OF MOBILIZATION

The entire BMP Foundation team wanted to take the time to highlight the magnificent work carried out by each Cabinet member. Thanks to their efforts, the Foundation is delighted to announce that the 2018-2022 Major Campaign was a major success! The Foundation surpassed its five-million-dollar goal and raised \$5,202,574! The Foundation is proud to be part of a region committed to improving healthcare and wishes to highlight that 90% of donations came directly from Brome-Missisquoi. Thank you!

A NEW ORTHOPEDIC CLINIC

As part of the 2018-2022 Major Campaign, the BMP Foundation inaugurated the new Bombardier-Beaudoin Orthopedic Clinic in 2020. The redevelopment of this clinic and modernized space enable orthopedic physicians and the clinical team to continue offering high-quality care in an environment better adapted to the needs of patients. Complementary technical facilities, such as medical imaging, are more easily accessible for patients with reduced mobility. In addition to new equipments, the surface area of the new premises has increased from 241 m² to 548 m².

Dr. Félix Munger, orthopedist, is very enthusiastic about these changes.

"Thanks to the support of BMP Foundation, we can now work in premises adapted to the needs of our patients," he said. "Being able to provide care in a welcoming, confidential, and well-designed environment is key for me and the entire team at the Bombardier-Beaudoin Orthopaedic Outpatient Clinic. The BMP Foundation has the power to make remarkable changes through community support."

EQUIPMENT PURCHASES

Thanks to donors who contributed to the 2018-2022 Major Campaign, the BMP Foundation was able to purchase more than \$1 million in new equipment for the Brome-Missisquoi-Perkins Hospital. Among these acquisitions, **eight new cardiac monitors were purchased** to improve the fluidity and speed of care offered. Mounted on the wall of each clinical observation cubicle, they are easily accessible to staff, who can also monitor results directly from a new central viewing console installed at the nurses' station. *"Much more sophisticated, accurate, and intuitive than their predecessors, they are proving to be indispensable tools in our department,"* said Mathieu Giroux, nurse. *"Our analyses can be carried out directly on the monitors, which can be easily programmed to suit each patient's individual needs. They save us a lot of time in our working day!"*

IMPROVED SURGICAL ROOMS

The surgical suite expansion project is part of the CIUSSS de l'Estrie – CHUS expansion and improvement portfolio, which runs from 2021 to 2031. This project must be assessed in the light of the growing needs of our population. Over the next few years, we plan to upgrade our medical equipment and physical facilities. These projects will help improve operating room technologies and provide more user-friendly facilities for the benefit of our patients. The Foundation maintains open communication with the CIUSSS to seize opportunities for improvement as they arise and will share information with its generous donors in due course.

SCHOLARSHIPS PROGRAM

The Brome-Missisquoi-Perkins Hospital Foundation scholarships have two objectives:

- To encourage and help local students to undertake or pursue college studies in the health or nursing fields, depending on the type of scholarship awarded;
- To establish and promote a positive relationship between the bursary recipient and BMP Hospital (CIUSSS de l'Estrie-CHUS) and encourage them to build a career within the RLS La Pommeraié.



HIGH SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIPS

The Foundation supports four local high schools by providing \$1,000 scholarships for graduates wishing to pursue their studies in the healthcare field. These students are selected by their educational institution.

CEGEP SCHOLARSHIP

Thanks to the generous contribution of the Chawkers Foundation, the BMP Foundation can offer the scholarship program for years to come. In addition, it has increased the amount of the bursary to \$2,000 per year for each scholarship recipient.

The BMP Healthcare Scholarship is intended for graduating students attending high schools in the region who wish to pursue studies in the DEC program in Natural Sciences. In 2022, this scholarship was awarded to Charlie Lottinville. The BMP - Nursing Scholarship is meant for future nursing students only and seeks to attract young people to this field, which is currently understaffed. Charlotte Hivon was the recipient of this scholarship in 2022. The two scholarships are worth \$6,000 each (\$2,000 per year for a maximum of 3 years). The two scholarship winners were chosen by a selection committee made up of a school principal, a BMP Hospital staff member, and a member of the community.

In 2022, a *Coup de Coeur* Bursary was also awarded to an exceptional candidate, Mia Tétreault.

SCHOOL VISITS

Due to the COVID-19 health and sanitary emergency in 2022, the BMP Foundation was unable to welcome secondary school students for guided tours. Spring 2023 marked the return of school visits to BMP Hospital. The four local high schools joined the BMP Foundation on March 10th and 17th, and April 14th and 21st for four half-day visits to six of the Hospital's departments: Medical Imaging, Pharmacy, Laboratory, Respiratory Therapy, Physiotherapy and Occupational Therapy, followed by a discussion led by two emergency nurses.

With these visits, the Foundation succeeded in reaching nearly 40 secondary 4 students who had shown an interest in healthcare. A dozen of them also expressed the wish to take part in a day of exploration, following the professional of their choice for eight hours.

Given the success of this event, the BMP Foundation, in collaboration with the guidance counselors, and with the invaluable support of the department heads and their employees, would like to set up another series of visits in addition to the spring ones. In November 2023, for example, the Hospital will welcome secondary 5 students prior to the deadline for their choice of CEGEP curriculum. In the future, these two annual events will enable us to make contact with as many young people as possible, so that they consider a career in healthcare, at BMP or elsewhere.

UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP In honour of Ms. Effie Margaret Côté

In November 2020, we were delighted to present a brand new scholarship offered by the BMP Foundation: the Effie Margaret Côté Scholarship. This important scholarship of \$10,000 is offered to a current nursing student or a current healthcare worker who is continuing their training at the university level. In 2022, the bursary was awarded to Élodie Couture.

A long-time volunteer with a passion for her community, Effie Margaret Côté has been involved with the BMP Hospital for over thirty years. This scholarship seeks to honour her commitment to our hospital. Throughout her life, Effie has been dedicated to volunteering. During World War II, she began as a volunteer with the Women's Catholic League, which provided hot meals to soldiers. Upon her arrival in our region, Effie became an active volunteer with BMP Hospital Auxiliaries and the Knowlton Wellness Project. Appointed to the Board of Directors of the BMP Hospital from 1982 to 1984, she received the International Women's Day Award from the Yamaska Valley Optimist Club in 2009. She was also named Volunteer of the Year by BMP Hospital in 2009.

MY SWEET BMP - \$4,000

The maple sugar shack event, My Sweet BMP, ended with two days of take-out food distribution to benefit the Brome-Missisquoi-Perkins Hospital Foundation. A total of 235 meals were ordered in 2022 by the participants! Thanks to their participation and donations, My Sweet BMP raised \$4,000 in profits.



THE CLASSIC BMP - TOGETHER FOR HEALTH - \$57,500

On June 22nd, 2022, the very first edition of the BMP Foundation's golf tournament, titled "TOGETHER FOR HEALTH", was held. Under the direction of the Honorary President, Jean-Michel Ryan, CEO of Mont Sutton, the amount of \$57,500 was raised. Profits from the silent auction totalled \$5,500 and were divided between two community organizations, Pleins Rayons and Maison Gilles-Carle de Brome-Missisquoi, whose missions parallel that of the BMP Foundation in collaborating with local organizations to help improve our community.



OKTOBERFEST BMP - \$40,131

The BMP Foundation was excited to host its first live BMP Oktoberfest since 2019 at Domaine de l'Artisan. Under the honorary chairmanship of Solène Robitaille, real estate broker with Remax Bromont, the fundraising event raised more than \$40,000. BOOTCAMP BMP - \$45,121

On December 2nd, 3rd and 4th, the BMP Foundation organized its first training course for physicians. Under the direction of BMP Hospital emergency physician Dr. Jean-Philippe Garant, and thanks to 25 registered physicians and the mobilization of over 100 volunteers, this fundraising training event raised over \$45,000 in benefits, in addition to giving our physicians the opportunity to pursue their continuing education and obtain accreditation to the highest Canadian standards.



On Thursday, December 1st, under the direction of BMP Hospital, the Foundation also organized a training session dedicated to BMP Hospital nurses, where participants learned how to puncture vessels in the upper limbs using ultrasound equipment.

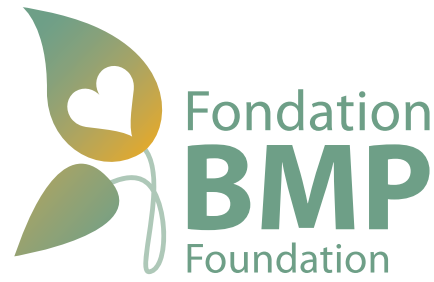

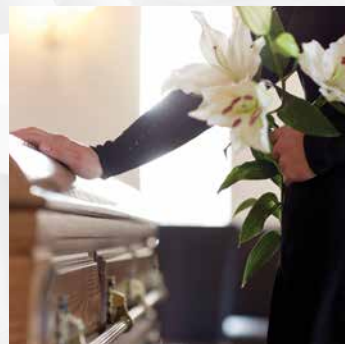

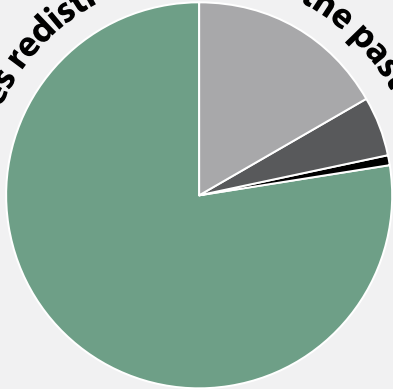

Incomes redistribution over the past 5 years



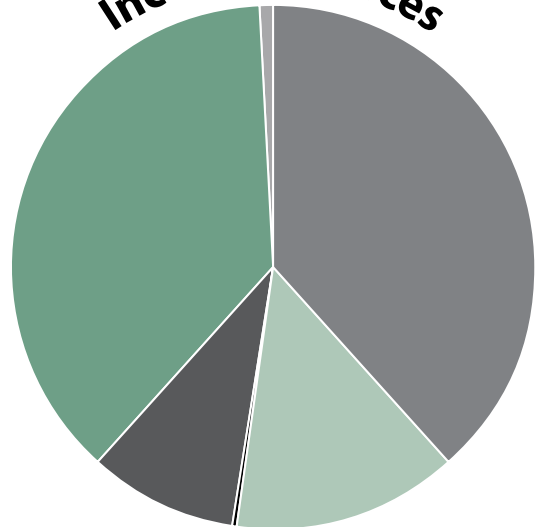

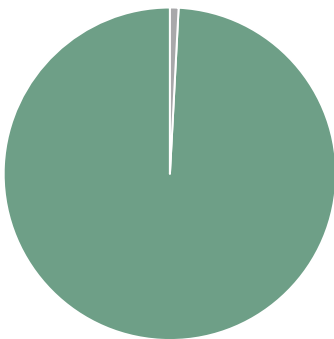

Incomes sources



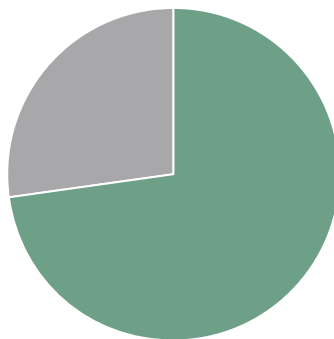

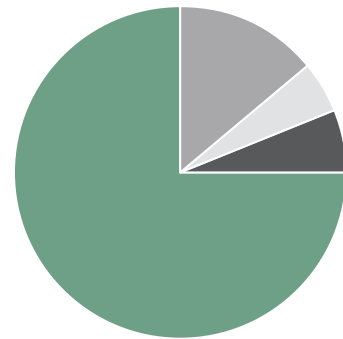
