SUPPORT FOR PEOPLE EXPERIENCING HOMELESSNESS

Through the Fonds de santé Brome-Missisquoi, the BMP Foundation donated \$25,000 to the Brome-Missisquoi Itinerant Committee to support the development of a day centre for those facing homelessness in the region to help break isolation, receive social support, and emergency meals. The project also involves providing emergency temporary housing for four individuals that are homeless, or who are facing homelessness, for a maximum of four months to help them get back on their feet. The warming centres, which the BMP Foundation supported last year, will also continue. These spaces provide a place to get warm, rest, and access important resources.



SUNFLOWER PROJECT

The Sunflower Project was launched in 2024 as a pilot project by the CIUSSS de l'Estrie - CHUS to identify healthcare workers and volunteers that can communicate and provide basic support in English to patients and users of certain healthcare establishments in Estrie. The goal was to improve communication services to better meet the needs of the English-speaking community within healthcare establishments.

The project was originally implemented in two locations, one being the BMP Hospital. Now, the initiative has been extended to other healthcare establishments in the region. The BMP Foundation is proud to be a financial partner for this initiative and to wear our sunflowers in support of English-speakers in Brome-Missisquoi!

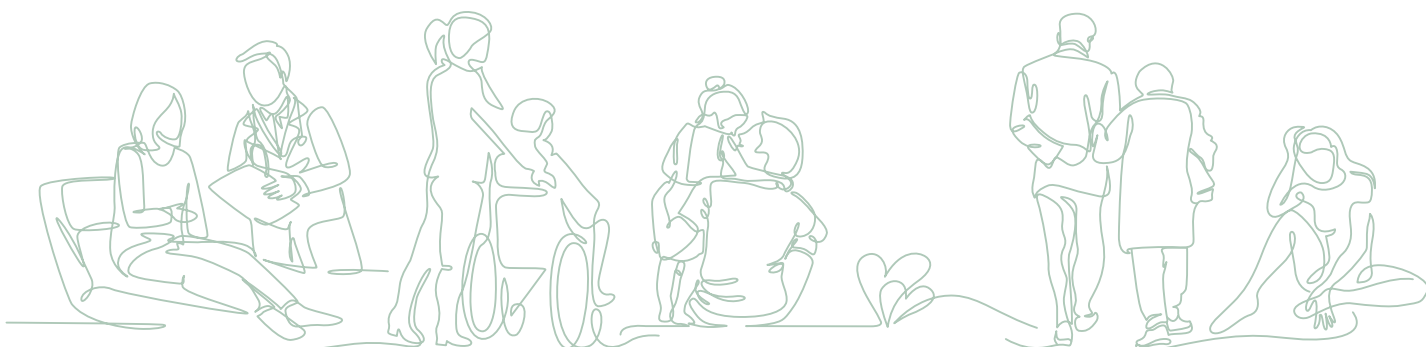


ART MURALS CHSLD IN SUTTON

The BMP Foundation added a spark of color in units 0 and 1 at the CHSLD in Sutton to create a more welcoming and livelier environment for residents.

In a previous funding request, we were able to install murals in units MVA and 2, which greatly improved the appearance and atmosphere for residents. We wanted to do the same for the two remaining units to make residents' environment warm and make their experience and that of their loved ones in the CHSLD more pleasant.

The physical environment is an essential part of the user experience. Residents can thrive better in an environment that resembles home and is far removed from the visual appearance of a hospital. We see this a lot in the units that already have murals installed. The total cost of the project was \$52,375.



THE ONCOLOGY PATIENT SUPPORT FUND

The BMP Foundation funds three special projects that support people in Brome-Missisquoi that have cancer or that are in remission to provide extra support during a vulnerable and difficult period.

Yoga and Movement

Since 2019, we have collaborated with certified Yoga4cancer'-teacher Laura Hernandez to offer free classes that are specifically adapted to patients with cancer or who are in remission. Over \$10,000 has been invested to provide this service, which has benefitted more than 100 people and offers four classes of 90 minutes.

Adapted training sessions

In 2024, we introduced a new service in collaboration with certified kinesiologist Gabrielle Duhamel. Gabrielle works with patients, particularly those who are immunosuppressed or whose pain requires a personalized approach to physical activity, to create physical training programs that are adapted to their needs. This service makes physical activity more accessible to patients and allows them to follow an independent training program at home. Interested patients can benefit from 3 x 75-minute sessions.

Group art therapy

In 2026, the BMP Foundation continued to expand on its programs by introducing group art workshops for cancer patients and their caregivers. This program is delivered by multidisciplinary artist and social worker Édith Cambrini. Five one-hour workshops are offered featuring artistic activities based on a theme related to cancer. For caregivers, there are five one-hour workshops featuring artistic activities based on a theme related to the effects of cancer on the loved ones of those affected by the disease.



PROJET RÉSONANCE AT THE CHSLD DE COWANSVILLE

At the beginning of 2026, the BMP Foundation funded a special project for caregivers at the CHSLD in Cowansville called Project Résonance.

Project Résonance helps support caregivers and their loved ones by providing a monthly support group, a activity for them, families, and residents, and the opportunity to take part in two training sessions. Furthermore, the training sessions are also opened to volunteers who wish to take part in the activities that are offered to include residents who have no family and/or no visitors.

These types of initiatives provide caregivers with the chance to speak about their experiences with others who understand what they are going through, creating a sense of relief and inclusion. The activities also help bring caregivers and their loved ones together in a welcoming and joyful atmosphere, and they open the door to important discussions.

We are proud to be a financial partner in this wonderful project!



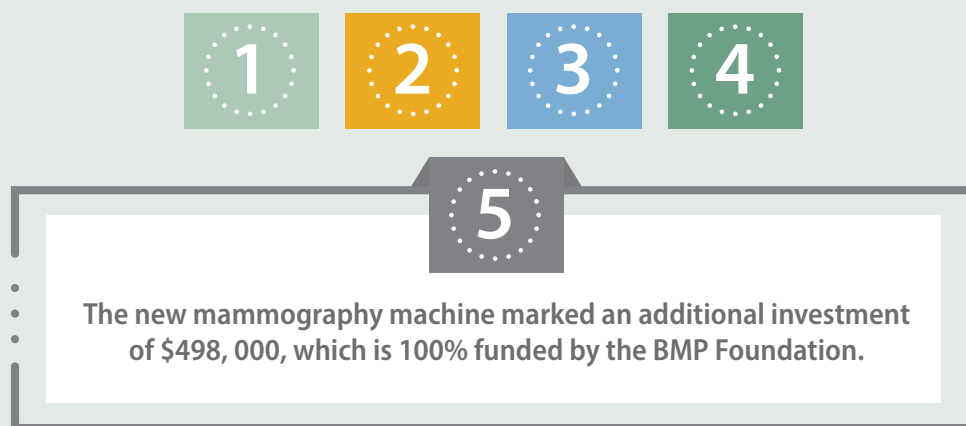


A MAJOR AND ESSENTIAL PROJECT FOR OUR COMMUNITY

Redesign of the Medical Imaging Department (Radiology)
2024-2026

RECAP OF INVESTMENTS FOR THE MEDICAL IMAGING DEPARTMENT

Phases one to four marked a total investment of \$7,468,080, with a \$2,240,424 contribution from the BMP Foundation.



The Medical Imaging Department performs more than 6,000 mammograms per year as part of the Quebec Breast Cancer Screening Program (PQDCS) and for diagnostic investigations and follow-ups for breast biopsies. In addition, the BMP Hospital is the only hospital in western Estrie equipped with a stereotactic table for performing breast biopsies and inserting harpoons that must be validated by mammography.

To consolidate access to screening and surgical care for patients at risk of breast cancer and reduce service interruptions, the mammography machine needed to be upgraded immediately. A new angio-mammography module was also added to enable the detection of lesions that may be invisible on traditional mammograms or ultrasounds. These improvements are essential to maintain access to breast exams for the population of Brome-Missisquoi.

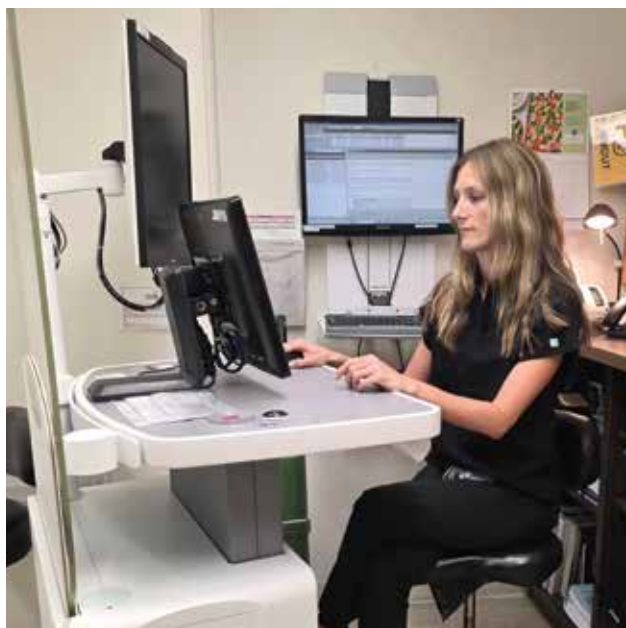

NEW MAMMOGRAPHY MACHINE

The BMP Foundation Commits to the Continuous Improvement of the Medical Imaging Department!

The new mammography machine and the addition of the module will help enhance:

- ✓ Image quality and thus diagnostic accuracy.
- ✓ Availability of mammography exams.
- ✓ Detection of otherwise undetectable lesions, without relying on long MRI wait times, through the addition of contrast-enhanced mammography.
- ✓ Management of patients at risk or undergoing investigation for breast cancer.
- ✓ Reduction of wait times and travel.





The Brome-Missisquoi-Perkins Hospital Foundation scholarships have two objectives:

- To encourage and help local students to undertake or pursue college studies in the health or nursing fields depending on the type of scholarship awarded.
- To establish and promote a positive relationship between the bursary recipients and BMP Hospital (CIUSSS de l'Estrie-CHUS) and encourage them to build a career within the RLS La Pommeraié.

EXCELLENCE SCHOLARSHIP

The Foundation supports four local high schools by providing \$1,000 scholarships for graduates wishing to pursue their studies in the healthcare field. BMP BRUNCH – \$46,000

The 34th edition of the BMP Brunch was one for the history books! On April 17, 2025, 348 people turned out at the Auberge West Brome for a delicious brunch in a friendly and festive atmosphere. SUPPORT FOR PEOPLE AT END-OF-LIFE AND FAMILIES IN BEREAVEMENT IN BROME-MISSISQUOI

The BMP Foundation is collaborating with the palliative home care team in RLS La Pommeraié (Brome-Missisquoi) to provide psychological and spiritual support to people living with an incurable illness, their caregivers, and their family. Approximately 200 patients and families are followed by the palliative home care support team each year and they currently have no free mental health services available to them.

THE PROJECT CONSISTS OF THREE COMPONENTS:

- 1 Psychological and spiritual support services at home provided by specialized practitioners in partnership with the Jeanne-Mance Foundation.
- 2 Production and distribution of a brochure on psychological support services provided by the environment to help users and their loved ones find the resources they need.
- 3 Production and presentation of a symbolic candle for caregivers during the visit post-mortem as a symbolic continuation of the strong and sincere partnership between the home care team and the caregiver.

We are glad to be supporting a project that will make a difference in the lives of patients and families in Brome-Missisquoi.

SPECIAL RECOGNITION EVENING FOR DR. ROBERT S. PINCOTT

In 2025, Dr. Robert S. Pincott, a former member of staff at the Brome-Missisquoi-Perkins Hospital and long-time supporter of the Foundation, was awarded with the Sovereign's Medal for Volunteers by the Chancellery of Honours.

The Sovereign's Medal for Volunteers recognizes exceptional volunteer achievements from across Canada and abroad. It is awarded to Canadians who have made significant contributions to their community. The medal is an official honour created by the Crown and is a part of the Canadian Honours System. The program replaced the Governor General's Caring Canadian Award created in 1995 by then Governor General the Right Honourable Roméo Leblanc.

To honour his achievement, the BMP Foundation held a special recognition evening at the BMP where we had the privilege to host a heartfelt award ceremony in the presence of over 40 family members, friends, and distinguished guests.

Dr. Pincott started his General Practice, now called Family Medicine, at the BMP Hospital in June 1961 and he retired from practice in 1997. During this time, Dr. Pincott demonstrated his commitment to providing accessible and quality healthcare in more ways than one. His commitment to the BMP Hospital is nothing short of an inspiration, and his spirit is at the core of the Foundation's mission to do whatever it takes to improve healthcare in Brome-Missisquoi.

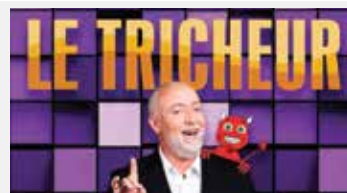
MAÎTRE GLACIER – \$200 IN TWO YEARS

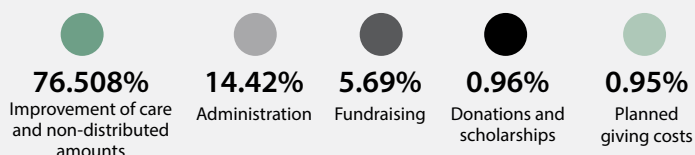

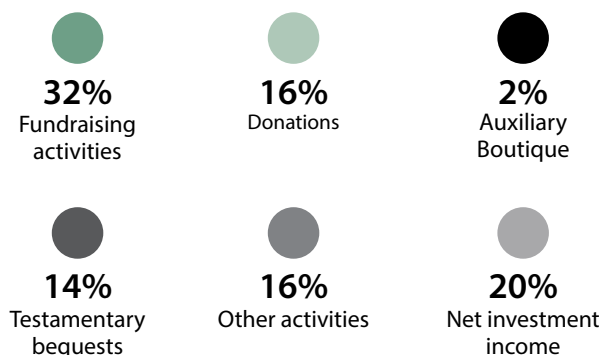
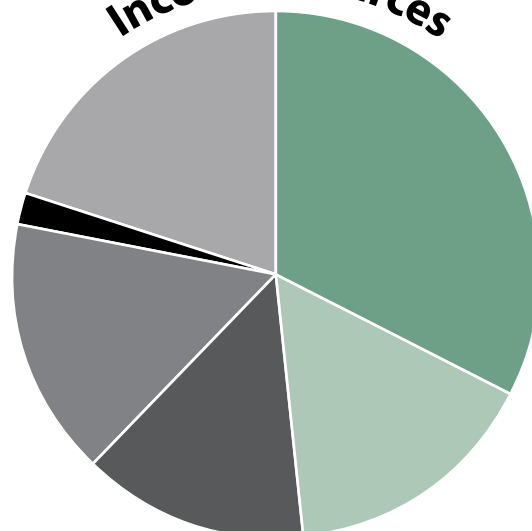
Incomes redistribution over the past 5 years



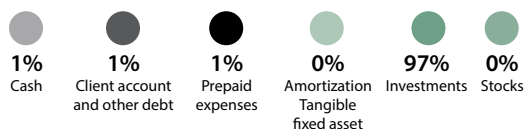
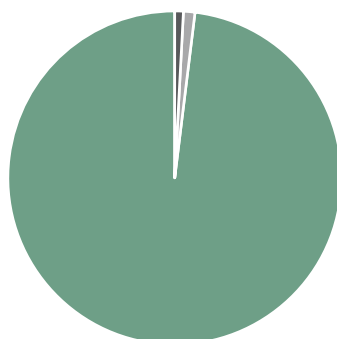
